FSM Transitional Arrangements

We are working closely with the FSM team to support you through data recording and analysis changes



"Our inspectors should not need, nor want, to see endless pages of data, cut to the nth degree on 10 different pupil characteristics. Torturing data is not just pointless. There is work in creating those analyses. There is work in discussing them and all too often many of the differences they may seem to show are probably just statistical noise. And there is work in designing and delivering interventions to address those apparent differences, and some of those aren't really justified. And I know that some of it happens because we have tended to over-analyse data too. Our intention is always to use data as the starting point, not as the end point, for inspection. We have redesigned inspection data reports to reduce the likelihood of over-interpretation."
